At Pentecost (or Whitsun) we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles. In medieval England, white vestments were worn (hence the name) and the whole of Whit week was a holiday. Nowadays, the liturgical colour is red, and the week's holiday survives as our Spring bank holiday. It should still be a day of great celebration and feasting!

Sunday Prayer Cycle
