The Vicar writes

This September is a good time for all of us at St Mary's to take stock and think about our future direction. We are welcoming new members to our team. Leanne Newman, our new children and families worker, introduces herself in these pages. Canon Margaret Marsh has recently joined our ministry team, and Andrew Sykes and Barbara Gibson-Sykes are in training as new pastoral assistants. A new team is preparing for the handover of much of the treasury responsibility in the months ahead. And, of course, we cannot forget the many church members who volunteer their time and gifts in every area of church life week by week. In addition, we continue to improve our facilities, such as the new church toilets - the expectation as I write this is that they will be completed by the start of September.

FEEDBACK

So the time is right to reflect on our future direction. For the past few years, PCCs in our diocese have been asked to prepare a Parish Development Plan each year. It turns out this is a useful exercise to help us decide the most fruitful areas to focus on each year. As we prepare to think about the Parish Development plan 2020, we would like your input! The past few years have seen so many good ideas come to fruition in the life of our church, and every single one of them started as someone's comment, feedback, or proposal. I am sure the same will be true of the years ahead. We have three simple questions we'd like you to answer (see page 7). IN CHURCH IN SEPTEMBER

Every Sunday we have our regular services of 8am Holy Communion and 9:30am Sung Eucharist - BUT watch out for the change of time on 8 September to 10am!

We get ready for the new term with the Praise@11 Book bag blessing all-age service at 11am on 1 September. Bring along your school bag - or work bag or another bag - to be blessed for the year ahead.

The following weekend, 7-8 September is our patronal festival celebrating the Virgin Mary to whom our church is dedicated. We begin on the evening of the 7th, with an organ recital given by Jonathan Holmes starting at 7:30pm. Tickets £8 on the door or £1 for under 16s.

Then on Sunday 8th, our 8am service is as normal but notice the time for the Sung Eucharist is 10am! The celebrant and preacher is the Bishop of Guildford, the Rt Revd Andrew Watson. The Bishop's visit to our parish is a very important occasion in the life of our church, and I would encourage

In the evening of 8 September, at 5pm, our inclusive all-age service All-in returns after the summer break. Always very interactive, with something for everyone, this service is followed at 6pm by Club Sandwich, our group for 7-12s.

On Sunday 15 September, it's time for Toddler Up at 11am. This is our brief and very informal service especially for toddlers and their families. At 5:30pm, the parish choir leads the singing at Choral Evensong, where we are able to enter more deeply into the scriptures and prayers through the Anglican choral music.

A Day for All this year is on Saturday 21 September. You can find more information in these pages, and the theme 'More creatures great and small' promises to make this another very popular day for our community.

Morning Prayer and Holy Baptism at 11:15am on 22 September is, as always, a service open to everyone, not just those who may know the children being baptized. St Mary's Singers lead the singing.

On 29 September we celebrate Michaelmas in all our services, when our scripture readings stretch our imaginations to encompass the angelic. The service of Choral Mattins is at 11:15am today. As with Evensong the emphasis is on the readings, prayers, and music, recalling the choirs of angels.

Next term's children's groups return on 9 and 12 September (Toddler Groups) and 11 September (Fun Day Wednesday). Children's Hour, during the 9:30am Sung Eucharist on Sundays, returns on 8 September, but note for that Sunday only the time is 10am.

ST MARY'S NEW ECO-GROUP

There was a real buzz of excitement and anticipation as St Mary's new eco-group met together for the first time on a sunny afternoon at the end of July!

The seven of us each shared our hopes and it was interesting as well as stimulating - and challenging - to hear the variety of ideas all designed to encourage better care of God's creation by St Mary's Church itself, by the individual members of our church and by the local community. The ideas included -

- Keeping the church grounds as wild as possible to attract and create a safe haven for wildlife.
- Using the church grounds as a space for prayer and reflection.
- Finding ways of interacting with the local community to inspire others to care for the environment - which could become part of our outreach.
- Taking on board the benefits of gardening on mental well-being - 'Going green can help beat the blues!'
- Forming links with the NESCOL students who work in the churchyard on a Thursday morning during term time.
- Considering whether St Mary's might become an 'Eco-Church'.

The group decided to meet monthly and set the date of 27 August for our next meeting. We also gave ourselves some homework to do before then!

NOO NOOS OF THE LOOS

The accompanying photograph, which includes the architect and contract manager, was taken in early August, and shows the scaffolding still in place for fixing the top timber edging and painting the upper parts, although the plastering has been completed internally and externally, all the wiring is in place, and the painter is at work inside at this time, as seen.

In addition, some of the toilet fittings were in place, and



the external drainage runs completed; the basic works then remaining included fitting the electrical appliances, doors, floor coverings, completion of the painting both to the new construction and the remainder of the north wall, reinstatement of the pews and Benefactors' Board, and, of course, most importantly, testing the pumping equipment.

The intention has been to keep the new construction in harmony with the remainder of the church, and although it may be too much to expect that it will eventually be thought to have always been there, it is none-the-less hoped that it will be considered unobtrusive.

At the time of writing, whilst inevitably keeping our fingers crossed (and, at the risk of being risqué, hopefully crossing nothing else), we are confident that the project will be completed by early September.

A number of people have been involved in helping achieve this project, and we should not, perhaps, forget someone who is no longer with us, Eve Myatt-Price; members of the congregation who knew Eve will be interested to learn that it had been a long held wish of hers to have toilets in the church, and now part of her legacy to St. Mary's has enabled her wish to come to fruition with the completion of this project.

COMMUNITY FLOWER FESTIVAL



Over the weekend of 21-23 June, St. Mary's Cuddington in Worcester Park held a **Community Flower Festival** in which flower arrangers from many local churches were invited to take part. The theme chosen for the festival was hymns or favourite songs.

Of course, arrangers from St. Mary's Ewell were up to the challenge and delighted to have the opportunity to get creative!

Sue, Enid and Lucy chose '**Eternal Father, strong to save, whose arm doth bind the restless wave**' as their hymn which they thought would work well below and around the pulpit. The flowers used were larkspur, gypsophila, antirrhinum & spray chrysanthemum, combined with garden foliage of ferns, soft ruscus, hostas, fennel, rosemary, Bells of Ireland and sprayed marsh marigold. A boat and some colourful wooden fish peeked out from the 'waves'.
