'COME AND SING' BRAHMS' REQUIEM Saturday 19 November

What a memorable evening this was! St. Mary's Parish Choir and friends led a performance of the Requiem by the German composer Johannes Brahms. Baritone soloist Timothy Tomkins was enthusiastically applauded by his fellows in the Parish Choir. Two pianists, in the arrangement for four hands, were Sarah Holmes and Simon Gregory. The conductor was Jonathan Holmes.

I believe there were two events in Brahms's life that were of paramount importance in the genesis of his Requiem. First and foremost, was the tragic story of the madness and subsequent death of Robert Schumann. Robert, and his wife Clara, had been instrumental in launching the career of young Brahms as a composer. He was highly conscious of the debt he owed to them. Secondly, Brahms's mother suffered a stroke in February 1865 from which she never recovered. Frau Brahms had encouraged her son's musical abilities both at home in Hamburg and on his tours as virtuoso pianist. It was unfortunate that Brahms could not be present at her death.

It was this event - the death of Brahms's mother - that later gave Brahms the stimulus to write an extra movement, in which a solo soprano voice declares "For I will comfort you, like as a mother giveth comfort" (Isaiah 66: 13). Tonight, however, we gave the version of the work's first performance, which took place at Bremen Cathedral on Good Friday (April 10) 1868. This extra movement had not yet been composed. Our pianists provided a foretaste of it by playing the music but without the singer.

That Brahms was still a young man at this time, is indicated by a photograph I have of a young, beardless Brahms posing with the luxuriantly bearded Karl Reinthaler, organist at Bremen Cathedral. Much correspondence survives between Reinthaler and Brahms, over the thorny issue of the composer's refusal to countenance any Latin, the language traditionally used in a requiem. Moreover, Brahms was adamant that he wanted no reference either to Christ or to His work of redemption anywhere in the work. He said it was to be a Requiem for the living, not the dead. The fact that Brahms and Reinthaler were well acquainted, was probably an advantage in this respect. Clara Schumann, who was present at the premiere, recorded in her diary that an amicable compromise was reached. Brahms's friend Joseph Joachim, the violinist, played some violin solos at the concert, and Frau Amalia Joachim, his wife, sang 'I Know That My Redeemer Liveth" from Messiah. That apparently started a tradition at Bremen which continued for many years.

An interesting footnote to this story is that, at the time, Herr Joachim, who spoke English, began writing an English translation of the Requiem. Diaries kept by friends certainly give the impression that Brahms was very much in favour of this plan. I feel sure that, had Brahms been present tonight, he would have approved of our performance.

SING-A-LONG SOUND OF MUSIC




On November 26 the church came alive to 'The Sound of Music' and what a wonderful and joyous occasion it was




