Fr Mark Stafford writes

Archbishop Designate, Sarah Mullally sets out her hopes for the Church

Shortly after the announcement of her nomination as the next Archbishop of Canterbury, Bishop Sarah Mullally delivered an address at Canterbury Cathedral, reflecting on her calling, the challenges facing the Church, and her hopes for its future.

Rooted in her early vocation as a nurse and shaped by her ministry in London, she spoke of "washing feet" as a guiding image of Christian service, and of finding hope in the quiet faithfulness of churches, chaplaincies, and communities across the Anglican Communion.

She addressed the Church's responsibility in safeguarding, the need to confront power dynamics, and the importance of standing against hatred and antisemitism.

She said she would seek to be "a shepherd who enables everyone's ministry and vocation to flourish," and expressed her desire to nurture confidence in the Gospel. "Held fast by the Lord's hand," she concluded, "please pray for me as I will pray for you."

EWELL VILLAGE ADVENT CALENDAR

The Ewell Village Advent Calendar is back! From 1 December, different letters – 'the clues' – will be displayed in the window or inside 22 local shops and on the outside notice boards of St Mary's Church and Christ Church, Ewell. Each shop and church will have a number from 1 to 24 designed by 1st Ewell Village (St Mary's) Brownies.

Every child wishing to take part will be given a special booklet to complete by writing next to each number the matching letter or 'clue'. St Mary's Church will have number 24. Answers to the puzzle can be delivered to 'All Things Nice' until noon on Tuesday 23 December and to St Mary's Church until just before the start of the 2.00pm Christmas Eve Crib Service.

An ideal time for children to find the clues will be on 5 December from 4pm to 8pm at 'Ewell Yule'. This is the annual community event when shops in the village are open late for shopping, with children's rides, festive food and drink, Morris Men, Phoenix Cloggs, carols and music. Car parking is free from 4pm.

CONCERT REVIEW

Saturday 11 October

THE MAELDUNE CONSORT

"Music from the courts, great houses and churches of the 'Golden Age' of English music, 1550-1650"

Performers: Susana de Oliveira (soprano, percussion); Tristram Clucas (tenor); Kate Jackson (viol, recorder); Helen Williams (viol, alto); Sue Benson (viol, alto); Christopher Benson (viol, bass, recorder)

Christopher writes in his programme notes: "England under the Tudor monarchs experienced an astonishing cultural renaissance in almost every artistic form: art, architecture, literature, drama and music".

In the Maeldune Consort's programme of sacred and secular music, the composers featured were nothing if not versatile. Many indeed are well known to St. Mary's churchgoers. That all-too-frequent name Anonymous made an appearance, in the guise of two madrigals "When Daphne from fair Phoebus did fly" and "The Dark is my Delight". Of the named composers, most were London-based. Thomas Morley opened proceedings in "Sing we and chant it" performed by the entire company. Two composers were fortunate to be appointed 'Gentlemen of the Chapel', or Singers of the Chapel Royal, a post which entitled the holder to special privileges. William Byrd was created a Gentleman of the Chapel on the accidental death of his predecessor Robert Parsons. Owing to Parsons' early death, few works of his survive. One that does is "Ave Maria, gratia plena" or 'Hail Mary, full of grace'. Despite Byrd's official recognition, he had to exercise great secrecy in writing his Latin Church music. His secular madrigals, however, needed no such caution. We heard "Tho' Amaryllis dance in green", "In Fields abroad" and "This sweet and merry month of May". Richard Nicolson was organist at Magdalen College, Oxford and, presumably for the edification of the undergraduates, wrote the humorous tenor-soprano duet "Joan, quoth John". His contemporary Michael East of Lichfield wrote "You meaner beauties of the night". Orlando Gibbons whose five-hundredth anniversary we celebrate this year, successfully combined sacred with secular music, as in "Ah, dear heart, why do you rise?" and "Almighty and Everlasting God". Thomas Tallis also managed to please both Catholic and Protestant patrons: "O Sacrum Convivium" ('O Sacred Banquet') and "If Ye Love Me, Keep my Commandments". Other composers wrote purely instrumental music. One was Richard Mico - of French descent - in Fantasia No. 16; the Fantasy or Fantasia being a popular form at the time. Among **John Jenkins'** large output is "Pavan in D minor". A pavan is a stately Spanish dance, often associated with the lively Galliard, and indeed we heard "Heart's Ease" and "Galliard" by another rather shadowy figure, Anthony Holbourne. Finally, John Dowland who worked abroad for most of his life, and who was brave enough to convert to the Roman Catholic church. He wrote much for both voice and instruments; among his extensive madrigal repertory is "Come away, sweet Love". As an encore, the evening's entertainment was nicely rounded off by Gibbons' wonderful madrigal "The Silver Swan".

This is the Archbishop of York's Advent Book 2025, In it, Bishop Guli makes connections between the themes of Advent and her own experiences - and invites us to do the same, so that we may be sustained through the complexities of life when meaning and hope can be hard to find.

'Women of the Nativity' by Paula Gooder £9.89. This book is an Advent and Christmas journey using nine imagined stories, all from the perspective of women. One commentator writes 'Once more Paula Gooder offers us her extraordinary blend of deep scholarship and empathetic story telling.'

I can guarantee there is always cake!






AV/SOUND DESK AT ST MARY'S

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 2025



On Remembrance Sunday we were pleased to welcome the Mayor and Mayoress of Epsom & Ewell, Cllr Robert and Mrs Marilyn Leach, our M.P, Helen Maguire BEM, the Deputy Lieutenant of Surrey, Cmdr F Thomson VR RN, members from the Royal British Legion and Veterans, officers of the Council, Army Cadets, 135 Geographic Squadron RE, St. Mary's Guides and Brownies, Scouts and many members of the public. We began with a procession from the Church to the War Memorial. The services here and that which followed in church were conducted by Fr Mark Stafford assisted by the Revd Sue Ayling and our LLM, Sara Holland. After initial prayers, the Act of Remembrance and the Exhortation, the standards were lowered at the sound of the Last Post, raised after 2 minutes silence at Reveille, followed by wreath laying.



Many then joined the Service of Remembrance in Church. The choir led the singing and the Standards were taken to the altar. The Bible reading from Revelation 21:1-7 was read by the Mayor, the sermon was given by Fr Mark and the Hymns included 'Praise my soul the King of Heaven', 'Abide with me' and 'O God our help from ages past'. ST. MARY'S ECO GROUP MONTHLY ECO TIP

CLEANING PRODUCTS

You can reduce the number of chemical-based cleaning products that you use by buying environmentally friendly ones instead. Many supermarkets now have their own brand of 'eco-friendly' cleaning products. Or, better still, use 'natural' cleaning methods. I recently unblocked the sink in my bathroom using boiling water, though it did need three attempts!

This month I have a sparkling clean kettle after using the following method: -

- 1. Fill the kettle with an equal part solution of water and white wine vinegar and let this soak for an hour. (Do not exceed the maximum level for liquid.)
- 2. Once the hour is up boil the kettle.
- 3. Then empty the kettle and rinse it thoroughly.

If you don't have any white wine vinegar to hand, try using ordinary household vinegar.


